 - a) Business arising from the minutes
 - Added addendum to the meeting minutes as council needed to vote outside of meeting to put forward funds to cover some of the BBQ costs (Including beverages, tax on food items, School cash online fees). Council wanted to keep the cost for our families as low as possible/similar to the previous years.
 - MOTION: A. Pronski motioned for approval, N. Sarin seconded motion
 b) BBQ debrief
 - council put together overview on how things went from their perspective, will be available to all families. In short, we felt the vendor was extremely professional and was able to keep up with mains (burgers/hotdogs) but we found the fries were holding up the line. Vendor realized he was not going to be able to cook churros and fries at the same time. Next year we plan to offer a ready made snack in lieu of the fries but perhaps offer churros as an option at the end.
- We have received preliminary results from the survey (only 20 surveys completed). Low number could be because we emailed out the QR code instead of the link so parents were unable to access it the following days after the BBQ. Link will be emailed out once more time in hopes to receive more responses. Survey results will be posted online.
- Updated survey results included at the end of these minutes
 - Mrs. McCann advised the staff were happy to not cook for the event and mingle with the families.

- Council hopes food can be available for a longer time next year in hopes teachers /volunteers can eat before parents arrive and parents have options to visit classrooms before they pick up their food. Still to be discussed
- © Council would like to work with the vendor and hope to put him on the approved vendor list.

Safety

- 1. Communication
 - When unsafe items have been found on the property Mrs. McCann advises the board and communication officer.
- Any individual who has been in our yard when the students were still on premises were asked nicely to leave and everyone has left quietly. Most are unaware the students are still in school.
 - Knife recently found in the yard was broken, not a pocket knife, but most likely brought on premises with a bag of fruit and snacks, which was also found nearby
 - 2. Morning Announcements & class discussion
 - Students are already being educated on not to pick up any unusual/unsafe items if found in the school yard and let a teacher/staff know immediately.
 - 3. Cameras
 - No elementary schools have cameras and cannot be installed
 - 4. Gates
 - They used to be locked at night but found the locks broken each morning, gates are now locked when students are in class, but not in the evening
 - 6 A gate has to be left open at night during teh winter to allow snowplows to come and plow
 - 5. Fencing
 - Our community either walks through, or uses our yard in the evening for many different reasons. We may cause more frustration by not allowing access at any time

Additional Feedback


- Suggestion to have more than one food truck (mentioned a lot!)
